

# Minutes of VHF Contest Committee Meeting held via Skype 31st January 2019

## 1. Entry levels

The final 2018 contest entry levels were reviewed. The data is attached at Appendix A. Overall levels of activity are broadly flat. UKAC activity appears to have reached saturation levels, but with some churn of clubs and entrants each year. Club based activity events such as AFS events continue to grow slightly. VHF NFD is the key exception to this and is remaining stubbornly flat at around 60 entrants. We considered whether we should add VHF NFD to the Club Championship, but concluded that this would have little impact on the sorts of clubs that we need to encourage to increase activity.

No specific actions were obviously needing to be taken from this data other than to continue to encourage weekend operation.

We agreed to enhance the data to include the following items and keep under review

- Band by band numbers in the SHF UKAC events
- Numbers of operators in VHF NFD and multi operator events
- Sweepers for VHF NFD (51 in 2017, 53 in 2018)
- Club numbers for the UKAC events (data below subsequently received from GD8EXI and included in Appendix A)

### 2. MGM contest progress

We recognised that that December 2018 MGM contest results were still outstanding, but that these are being progressed as quickly as possible.

We have now run the first weekday evening MGM events prior to the UKACs. Feedback has been positive, but there has been some confusion over how best to operate, with the use of contest mode to WSJT-X causing particular confusion.

There were quite a number of stations active who did not enter these first contests. We thought that this might have been due to confusion on how to create an entry file from the what WSJT produces. We felt that some additional guidance was essential. We will continue to monitor the position around stations active and non-entering and will consider approaching some to investigate why.



We set the rules and simple exchanges with the old FT8 exchange structure in mind (not using contest mode) in part to keep compatibility with casual FT8 operation. We discussed this position at some length and agreed to hold with the current guidance. We fully expect the world of MGM modes to move very quickly, and recognise that it might be challenging for us to always keep the rules well aligned with reality, but we will continue to monitor closely, and will consider making changes to the rules during the year if essential.

We will review the position around contest mode exchanges in FT8 for these MGM contests for 2020.

We will publish a set of operational guidance for the UKAC MGM contests.

## 3. UKAC Station Sharing

G4PIQ has received further complaints (provided to the committee members) from multiple independent sources about club stations being shared by many individual entrants in the UKACs and building up much larger club score contributions than a normally operated station could create. This was echoed from additional sources by other committee members. As a result of this feedback and considering the potential impact on results, we felt that we needed to review the position we had taken when setting the 2019 rules and provide some guidance on what constituted acceptable use of the station sharing rule.

We agreed that no more than 3 entrants sharing a single physical station would count towards their club score, however any additional entrants would still be accepted as individuals.

We considered how best to communicate this. In order to be equitable and to demonstrate that we are listening to our entrants, we felt that the right approach was to publish this guidance in a Newsletter update, along with the Facebook Group and groups.io reflector. Wording will be agreed off-line and the Newsletter published on or before Saturday 2nd Feb, so as to be in place before the February UKACs. The MGM guidance should also be available for this Newsletter.

[Post meeting note: A new rule (3f) was added to the VHF General Rules (<a href="https://www.rsgbcc.org/vhf/rules/19rules/General.shtml">https://www.rsgbcc.org/vhf/rules/19rules/General.shtml</a>) to cover this behaviour. The new rule comes into force on 01/03/2019.]

## 4. Publicity

We briefly discussed the situation with publicity and agreed to continue to engage a possible volunteer.

Action: G4PIQ / G8TIC to make contact.

G8TIC told us that the Facebook group now has over 1000 (almost all UK) members and is therefore a great way to disseminate information.

### 5. C5 Contest Working Group (C5CWG)

G0FCT gave us an update on the work inside the IARU C5 contest working group. The IARU rules are expected to remain stable for the next 3 to 5 years, including their position on MGM. There have been some changes in the leadership of the committee. Ian will continue to take part.

### 6. Any Other Business

G8TIC raised the issue of whether it would be a useful action to create an open source database of callsigns / locators so that everyone is working to a common playing field and anyone can contribute updates.
