

## Minutes of VHFCC Meeting 16<sup>th</sup> September 2022

#### 1. Review of Actions

G0FCT to examine and circulate a discussion on options to reduce complexity of multipliers – **Complete** 

G4PIQ to organise a survey – Complete

G4PIQ to discuss with other IARU societies approach to submitting entries to IARU contests - **Ongoing** 

## 2. Review of VHF Contest Activity Levels

An updated table showing the entry levels into the various contests is attached at Appendix A.

For the first time in some years we are starting to see a decline in entries – although a significant part of this appears to be a reversal of the boost given by lockdown. There may also have been a corresponding dip as lockdowns were released and people took the opportunity to do different things. To attempt to take these effects into account, a column has been added to consider whether the contest is in decline relative to its pre-COVID levels. The level of activity relative to pre-COVID levels are broadly categorised below



**Healthy** – UKACs and FMACs, 50, 70, 144 AFS contests, Low Powers, MGM (single contest now back in its April slot), Xmas (with its new format), 70 MHz, 144 MHz & 432 MHz Trophy contests, 10 GHz Trophy (though still a small entry), 70 MHz CW (though absolute levels quite low), Low Powers, Marconi

**Some Decline** – 432 MHz AFS, March 2/70, April 4m, May & Oct UHF, 50 MHz Trophy, 50 MHz CW, 1.3 GHz and 2.3 GHz Trophies

Significant Decline - 70 MHz Cumulatives, April 50 MHz, Backpackers, VHF NFD

Some of these contests such as VHF NFD, AFS and the Trophies are structural parts of the calendar, co-ordinated with IARU, or co-ordinated with other events (e.g. Backpackers), so no action will be taken for now other than to try and encourage more activity.

However – we are considering not running the declining April 6m, 4m Cumulatives, and April 4m events in 2023 to reduce the number of weekend events to try and help drive some concentration of activity. 4m in particular has had a significant increase in the number of events since the UKACs moved from 3 per year to 12 per year. We will raise this in the consultation.

We also propose to ask for ideas to improve activity within the 23cm and 13cm trophies.

We propose to stop pre-registration for VHFNFD to remove a hurdle to entry. **AP – G4PIQ to talk to G4FAL to discuss whether HFCC wish to do the same for the HF NFDs.** 

We will also extend the setup period for VHF NFD to 48 hours (only retaining it to prevent the use of fixed stations), and look for further options to simplify VHF NFD rules. **AP – G0FCT to look for options to simplify VHF NFD rules.** 

### 3. Update from IARU C5 Group

There has been little activity during the last period. The contest sub-committee has been running, with a few short meetings, but no changes of note to report.

#### 4. Automation of Entries to IARU Contests

Currently we continue to promote submission of entries to the IARU contests by providing a link to the IARU robot from the RSGB submission page, however this is not well used. We have not allowed automatic submission because of GDPR concerns. It seems possible that the GDPR issues could be worked around by having the user select a checkbox to grant permissions, but now issues are coming to light over IARU's policy, mechanism for accepting bulk entries and a need to have all EDI fields completed. It looks like some other IARU societies may be submitting bulk entries, so this needs more detailed discussion with IARU. AP – G4PIQ to make contact with IV3KKW and discuss.

#### 5. Further Automated of Claimed Scores

We discussed whether it would be appropriate automatically populate the claimed scores pages with entrants' claimed scores as they are submitted. The view of the meeting was that



prior to the log submission window closing, it should be the choice of the entrants as to whether to make their scores public or not. Full claimed scores are already available at the Log Received links after log submission closes, although we don't believe that this is well known. AP – G4CLA to add some text and link to promote the fact that all claimed scores are available after log submission closes.

## 6. Rule Changes

- a. We agreed to align our postcode list with the HF one so Norfolk will become NK, and potentially BT will be added to the HF list. AP G0FCT to identify any discrepancies and agree with HFCC and VHFCC.
- b. We agreed to require the e-mail address required alongside an entry should be one which the entrant monitors, and should the adjudicator attempt to contact the entrant, but does not receive a response, the entry will become a checklog.
- c. We agreed to amend General Rule 4j from "All information must be copied and confirmed at the time of the QSO, over the air and only on the band in use" to "All information must be copied and confirmed during the contest period, over the air and only on the band in use". This makes it clear that it is permissible to correct / complete data on-air later in the contest.
- d. We discussed whether the current rule that stops stations changing affiliated club in the UKACs after the first 6 months could be preventing some valid (non-gaming) moves. We will amend this to allow moves subject to VHFCC permission (which will be given except where we believe the application to be for gaming purposes)
- e. We agreed to add a single Overseas section to the 4m Trophy (to bring it in-line with the 6m Trophy). We had received a kind offer of some trophies for such a section but at this time, given the developing nature of the section, we are choosing to decline that offer. **AP G4PIQ to contact donor**
- f. The FT8ACs have taken off quite successfully, and there have been several requests to allow more time. In spite of having asked the question last year (before the success of the events was clear) we will consult again on whether to have a full 4 hour section as an option aligned with the rest of Europe.
- g. We agreed not to add a 23cm FT8AC at this time
- h. The 4<sup>th</sup> Backpacker date this year was erroneously separated from the 144 MHz Low Power in 2022. We will move it back to its normal position for 2023 and check other dates. **AP G4PIQ to send G0FCT the submission to the Yearbook.**
- i. We are not proposing to make any date changes for contests for 2023. There have been comments about the 4m Trophy being on a Saturday rather than a Sunday for the past 2 years both positive and negative. This change was made to ensure that we don't have a VHF Championship event (the 4m Trophy) and an HF Championship event (the Low Power Contest) running simultaneously since entrants should have the ability to compete in both these prestigious competitions if they so wish. The alignment with the start of the IARU 4m event is a bonus from this decision. Entries in



the 4m Trophy are healthy relative to other weekend contests with this year being the second highest recorded.

## 7. Consultation

We have identified some possible subjects for consultation, but will not 'launch' the consultation until after the RSGB Convention to allow the opportunity for refining the question set.

#### 8. Convention & Hamfest

We are fully staffed with two volunteers for the Hamfest. Thanks to G4HGI for organising this and to GW4SHF for supporting.

We will have a stand at the Convention for people to come and find us. We will dry-run the Hamfest material there and try and have some SDR contest recordings available.

AP – G4CLA to see if he has a 2m Trophy recording.

## AP - G4HGI to contact Mark Algar regarding photographs

G4HGI kindly offered to help G6XSY and her other volunteers move trophies for the presentations.

Since this will be the first set of trophy presentations for 3 years, we will have some recipients from the previous 2 years who we ought to recognise as best we can within the available time. **AP - G4PIQ and G6XSY to discuss the approach with G4FAL.** 


